There was a collective sigh following a very busy Thanksgiving and Christmas season! In reflecting on the past months, we are very conscious that your generous donations made it possible to help many families and individuals. You made it possible to provide a box of food to 251 households at Thanksgiving. At Christmas, you provided another 313 households with a box of food. In addition, you helped to give new clothing gifts to 122 children and new toys to 118 children.

Overall in 2016, your generosity provided 128,503 meals in the dining room and pantry. In another area, 489 haircuts were given to those wanting to get their ears lowered. The Necessary Store was well-utilized, as it helped 2,954 guests with personal care items and cleaning supplies.

### FINAL FANTASY



## MISSION MOMENT

*Heart, Love & Soul touches its guests in more ways than just providing nourishment. We share the following Mission Moment with you:*

I walked into the foyer, and there sat a man all alone in his mid-30s. He looked dejected and just plain weary. Generally, I greet guests waiting there and keep on moving, but this gentleman's demeanor stopped me. I asked how he was doing and he briefly told me his sad story. Over many years, he used drugs and knew he was on a pathway to death. His drug abuse caused severed relationships, criminal activity, abuse of his body, and a total disregard for his very life. He voiced that he had to stop using; he could not go on this way. I listened carefully and watched this disheartened man tell of a life wasted on drugs. Then he told me that this day he was going to First Step to begin a drug rehab program. I encouraged him to use the program for all he was worth. As I was leaving the foyer, I promised to hold him in my prayers. He nodded his head. Would you join me in praying for him?

## A DOUBLE BLESSING

For more than a year, Heart & Soul has been the beneficiary of volunteer services from Niagara-Orleans BOCES Community Outing Work Experience. Approximately once a month, these young volunteers work together, one-on-one with a teacher, on a project for us. Projects vary according to our need. One such project involved packing bags of candy, which we later distributed with the Thanksgiving and Christmas food baskets. Another time, the young people scooped fancy loose tea, which had been donated, into tiny cloth tea bags. Eventually the tea bags were distributed through the pantry.


